Horizon Europe and United Kingdom

The UK Government and European Commission have come to an agreement on the association of UK to Horizon Europe. <u>The deal means that UK scientists will now be able to receive European Research Council grants and coordinate academic-industrial consortia in Horizon Europe.</u>

It confirms that from UK will be able to fully participate from 1 January 2024 in the 2024 work programme – a list of the projects Horizon Europe will fund that year - and onward, including 2024 calls that open this year.



For calls under the 2023 work programme, however, UK researchers will still have to use UK backup guarantee scheme to fund their participation in any Horizon projects. The agreement is only until the end of Horizon Europe in 2027.

Horizon Europe and Switzerland


Switzerland is currently not associated to Horizon Europe and is considered a "Third Country" to the programme. The Swiss Federal Council is committed to obtain full association to Horizon Europe before the end of the programme (2027).

Swiss entities CAN participate in most Horizon Europe calls. Funding is provided by the Swiss government as long as Switzerland is not associated to the programme. Yet, participation of Switzerland in EU-Horizon needs to be checked in advance, before the application takes place.

Horizon Europe and Hungary

On 15 December 2022, the Council of the European Union adopted an <u>implementing decision</u> prohibiting certain Hungarian institutions from entering into legal commitments regarding the EU budget, e.g. Horizon Europe grant agreements. This measure has been taken to protect the EU budget against breaches of the principles of the rule of law in Hungary.

This decision affects <u>21 universities</u> in Hungary administered through trusts established by Hungary's Law IX of 2021.

Specifically, this means that no Grant Agreements or other funding commitments under Horizon Europe can currently be signed with the entities in question. Ongoing projects are not affected by the measures.

It is still possible to submit proposals in Horizon Europe with the Hungarian institutions concerned. However, since the duration of the restrictions is not foreseeable, it is advisable to compose the consortium in such a way that the project would be eligible even without the Hungarian participation.

The <u>National Contact Points in Hungary</u> will be available to help with any questions or difficulties regarding the Grant Agreement Preparation.

European Partnerships in Horizon Europe

What are European Partnerships?

European Partnerships are initiatives in which the European Commission and public and/or private partners collaborate to fund research and innovation activities that contribute to tackle European and global challenges. They currently coexist with other still active co-funding initiatives (e.g., ERA-NETs, Joint Programming Initiatives or European Joint Programmes) launched in previous EU framework programmes for research and innovation.

Types of European Partnerships

There are three types of European Partnerships:

- Co-Funded European Partnerships involving research funders and other public authorities in EU Member States and Associated Countries. They are the successors of the European Joint Programmes (EJP) and the ERA-NET actions under Horizon 2020.
- **Co-Programmed European Partnerships** between the European Commission and private and/or public partners. They are the followers of the Public-Private Partnerships of Horizon 2020.
- Institutionalised European Partnerships between the European Union, EU Member States and/or industry. They are based on a Council Regulation or a Decision by the European Parliament and Council. In Horizon 2020 they were called Art. 185/187 initiatives or Joint Undertakings. In addition, the European Institute of Innovation and Technology - Knowledge and Innovation Communities (EIT-KICs) are also institutionalised partnerships.

Current European Partnerships

The portfolio for the period 2021-2024 includes 49 partnerships. They are grouped in the following five areas (the links lead to the website of the European Commission where the list of partnerships in each area as well as information about each partnership is available):

- health
- <u>digital</u>, industry and space
- climate, energy and mobility
- food, bioeconomy, natural resources, agriculture and environment
- partnerships across themes

Further partnerships shall be included in the period 2025-2027.

European Partnerships calls

Researchers of the University of Potsdam might apply to the calls for proposals that European Partnerships launch. The partnerships usually announce the calls on their websites. In the text of the call, applicants find information about expected grant amount per project, funding rate (the grant might cover 100% of the projects cost or an own contribution might be required), eligibility criteria, proposal requirements, application procedure and deadlines.

The information platform <u>ERA-LEARN</u> provides a database of past, current and upcoming calls. In addition, the EU Research Funding newsletter of the University of Potsdam includes a selection of calls for proposals directed to organisations based in Germany (see next section).
