The Chair of Empirical Economics at the University of Potsdam is looking for a

Research Associate in Applied Microeconometrics

starting on **December 1, 2019** (or later).

The position (50%, TV-L13), is initially limited to **one year** (and can be extended up to **three years**). It is tailored to advanced PhD students in Economics (2nd year onwards), with an excellent training in microeconometric methods and prior experience in applied data work. Applications from students with an excellent Master's degree who want to start a PhD will also be considered.

The successful applicant will work with <u>Prof. Caliendo</u> on **empirical research projects** in the field of labour economics, policy evaluation or entrepreneurship. The aim is to publish research results in high-ranking journals and to contribute to the debate on economic policy. Additionally, the successful applicant would support the teaching activities of the team in Statistics and Econometrics with 2 SWS.
