EU policy updates

Interim evaluation of Horizon Europe

End of April 2025 the European Commission finished the interim evaluation of Horizon Europe, the EU's flagship research and innovation programme for 2021-2027. The programme was **positively assessed** with regard to impact, innovation, scientific excellence, simplification and the inclusion of "widening countries" (those with lower research and innovation performance). The evaluators estimate that **every euro of Horizon Europe expenditure will generate up to six euros of benefits for EU citizens by 2045**.

The Commission will use the interim evaluation's insights to enhance its policies and programmes. Upcoming Work Programmes will include measures to **simplify the application process and project implementation**. Targeted investments will further support **researchers and entrepreneurs**, ensuring that the EU continues to attract, nurture, and retain talent, and that collaboration brings stakeholders closer together, helping to translate knowledge and results into the market. In pursuit of these goals, the Commission will work to **expand the ERC and the EIC**. **MSCA and the Choose Europe Programme** will be supported too. Ursula von der Leyen confirms self-standing FP10

In her <u>speech at the Annual EU Budget Conference 2025</u>, EU Commission President Ursula von der Leyen emphasized the importance of a European Competitiveness Fund with simpler rules and transparent procedures. Nevertheless, she made it clear that the "framework programme Horizon Europe will stay as a self-standing programme. It is an outstanding brand – the most renowned research programme worldwide. But it will be tightly connected to our Competitiveness Fund. We need a seamless flow from fundamental research to applied research to start-ups to scale-up". Although much remains uncertain, such as the future of the



"clusters" in Pillar 2 or whether there will be a ring-fenced budget for the next framework programme, this is a meaningful step towards clarifying the structure of the Competitiveness Fund and acknowledging the central role of FP10.

EU strategy for AI in science approved



On 23 May 2025, the EU Council has approved a set of conclusions titled "Towards the EU strategy on AI in science". The document calls for a comprehensive strategy to increase the use of AI in science, taking an ethical, sustainable, inclusive and human-centric approach. AI is widely used for data analysis, simulations, and large language models, driving new discoveries and enhancing research efficiency. The conclusions emphasize the importance of AI in supporting both basic and applied research, and highlight its critical role in addressing global

challenges, meeting societal needs, improving competitiveness, and facilitating Europe's digital transformation. A detailed press release is published on the website of the EU Council.

ERC news

ERC welcomes new budget for 'super grants'

The Scientific Council of the European Research Council (ERC) will provide a substantial additional budget for the development of a new funding instrument offering larger, longer-term grants. These grants will follow the same principles as other ERC grants, i.e. projects will be selected on the basis of scientific excellence only (more information on the <u>ERC website</u>). Operational details of the new funding instrument are being developed by the Scientific Council and will be announced in due course.

<u>Increased ERC funding for top global researchers moving to Europe</u>



Researchers based in the USA or elsewhere in the world who wish to relocate to Europe can apply for up to € 2 million on top of the usual grant amount. This change to the current ERC Work Programme (see p. 18) means that the additional funding available to non-EU researchers is twice as high as in previous years. Since May, applicants for the 2025 Advanced Grants call can benefit from



this new regulation if they move from a Third Country to Europe. Additional funding may be used by PIs for establishing their laboratories as well as for personnel costs. As before, applicants are requested to define and justify the need for additional funding. You can find more information here.

Changes to the 2026 and 2027 Work Programmes

The 2026 Work Programme is expected to be published in July 2025. In addition to the above-mentioned changes, which have already been incorporated into the 2025 Work Programme, further novelties are planned for 2026 and 2027, as announced in a <u>press release on the ERC website</u>:

- From 2026 on, Part B2 of the Scientific Proposal will now be limited to seven pages for Starting, Consolidator, and Advanced Grant applications and ten pages for Synergy Grant applications. Part B1 should no longer include details on the feasibility of the scientific approach, but rather present a convincing overall research strategy.
- There will be **new resubmission restrictions for Synergy Grants** e.g. applicants who obtained a score of 'B' in Step 1 of the 2025 Synergy Grant call may not be eligible to apply for the 2026 Synergy Grant call.
- From 2027 onwards, eligibility windows for Starting and Consolidator Grant applications shall be extended. Researchers will be able to apply for a Starting Grant immediately after successfully defending their PhD, and at any time within the following ten years. Consolidator Grant applicants will be eligible to apply between five and fifteen years after successfully defending their PhD.

MSCA news

MSCA Choose Europe for Science pilot initiative

The MSCA Choose Europe for Science pilot action will support projects recruiting postdoctoral researchers with the aim of offering them longer-term employment beyond the project period. Projects should recruit at least 3 researchers for up to 5 years. The first 2 to 3 years are MSCA-funded. Institutions must then provide funding (internal or external funds) for 2 more years. A beneficiary may receive up to €3,5 million for this call. The deadline for submissions is 3 December 2025. Further information can be found on the MSCA website of the European Commission.

REA study on the career impact of Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions (MSCA)

On 16 May 2025, the Research Executive Agency (REA) published the <u>results of a recent survey</u> <u>of researchers</u>, which focused mainly on the career paths taken by MSCA grantees. In general, <u>around 87% of fellows were employed or self-employed two years after the fellowship</u>, and



a majority (57%) considered that the fellowship had contributed to a large or very large extent to obtaining their current position. Overall, 86% rated the quality of their MSCA fellowship training as good or very good. Of those surveyed, 69% were still working in an EU country, 13% in the UK, 8% in an associated country, and 10% in a non-associated country. The majority of employed participants (90%) still worked in research and innovation.

Association of Third Countries to Horizon Europe

Egypt

Negotiations on Egypt's association to Horizon Europe have concluded successfully. The **agreement is expected to be signed by November 2025**. A transitional agreement already allows Egyptian entities to apply for funding under calls implementing budget from 2025 and onwards. Read the full article <u>here</u>.

Horizon Europe Work Programmes

The European Commission has published the main Work Programmes 2025 for Horizon Europe, including the following funding lines:

- Research infrastructures
- the six thematic Clusters
- EU Missions
- European Innovation Ecosystems
- Widening participation and strengthening the ERA
- New European Bauhaus Facility
- Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions (MSCA)

You can download the new Work Programmes for Horizon Europe <u>here</u>. The publication of the Work Programmes is accompanied by a series of information days, which can be viewed <u>here</u>.

In parallel, preparation of the 2026-2027 Work Programmes is ongoing. Draft versions have been published on the <u>KOWI website</u>. The finalization of the documents is planned for the end of 2025.

Digital Europe Programme: Work Programme 2025-2027

The Digital Europe Programme (DIGITAL) focuses specifically on developing digital capacities and infrastructure in Europe. It covers areas such as high-performance computing (supercomputing), artificial intelligence, cybersecurity, and digital skills. Through a series of calls for proposals, DIGITAL provides funding for research and innovation projects in these areas. The <u>DIGITAL Work Programme 2025-2027</u>, which was published at the end of March 2025, addresses contemporary challenges identified in the current European Commission's political priorities relating to tech sovereignty, democracy and security. Furthermore, it is linked to the implementation of the Chips Act and the Artificial Intelligence Act, as well as to the need to develop, integrate and adopt AI in Europe.

New version of the Annotated Model Grant Agreement

An updated version of the Annotated Model Grant Agreement has been published on the <u>EC</u> <u>website</u>. This guide to interpreting the model grant agreements is crucial not only for effective project implementation, but is also a valuable resource for proposal writing.
