EU policy updates

European Commission proposal on FP10 published

On 16 July 2025, the European Commission presented its proposal for the new EU financial framework (2028–2034), including the next EU Framework Programme for Research and Innovation, which will once again be named "Horizon Europe" and will be closely linked to the new European Competitiveness Fund. With a total budget of around €175 billion, Horizon Europe will receive a significant financial boost from 2028 onwards.

The new framework programme is expected to be based on four pillars:

- Pillar I Excellent Science (approx. €44.1 billion): European Research Council (ERC); Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions (MSCA); Joint Research Center (JRC).
- Pillar II Competitiveness and Society (approx. €75.9 billion) for collaborative projects in the following thematic areas: Clean Transition and Industrial Decarbonisation; Health, Biotech, Agriculture and Bioeconomy; Digital Leadership; Resilience and Security, Defence Industry and Space; Global Societal Challenges; EU Missions; New European Bauhaus Facility
- Pillar III Innovation (approx. €38.8 billion): European Innovation Council (EIC); Innovation Ecosystems and the Knowledge Triangle
- Pillar IV European Research Area (approx. €16.3 billion): ERA Policies; Research and Technology Infrastructures; Widening Participation and Spreading Excellence

The proposal is subject to negotiations and approval by the European Parliament and the Member States in the European Council, with a final agreement expected in 2027.



ERA Policy Agenda 2025-2027



On 23 May 2025, the European Council endorsed the European Commission's proposal for the second European Research Area (ERA) Policy Agenda 2025—2027.

The ERA Policy Agenda is a comprehensive roadmap for enhancing Europe's research and innovation ecosystem. It addresses key challenges like

knowledge mobility, sustainability, and international competitiveness, while ensuring measurable outcomes and the broad voluntary participation of Member States and stakeholders. Compared to the first ERA Policy Agenda (2022–2024), which comprised 20 actions, the updated agenda distinguishes between 11 long-term oriented ERA structural policies and 8 specific, goal-oriented ERA actions. These initiatives will be carried out by Member States on a voluntary basis.

ERC news

ERC Work Programme 2026 published

On 8 July 2025, the <u>European Research Council (ERC) published its annual work programme for 2026</u>. The programme defines the funding modalities, budget, call periods, and eligibility criteria for the upcoming calls. As previously announced, applicants will be required to divide their scientific proposals into two parts: a concise, five-page Part I outlining the scientific idea and objectives, and a more detailed Part II of up to seven pages (up to ten pages for Synergy Grants) focusing on implementation and methodology. Only if the proposal passes Step 1 of the evaluation procedure will Part II be assessed. The programme also confirms an increase in funding for researchers from outside the EU who wish to relocate their work to Europe. In addition, the eligibility rules for Starting and Consolidator Grants as well as the resubmission restrictions for Synergy Grants have been updated.

To support applicants, the EU Research Funding team at the University of Potsdam has prepared a set of factsheets with concise overviews of all ERC funding schemes. These can be found in the <u>"Resources" section of the EU Research Funding pages on the UP website</u>.

EIC news



Draft EIC 2026 Work Programme available

The <u>draft EIC Work Programme for 2026</u> is now available and includes several new features.

One of these is the "EIC Advanced Innovation Challenges" pilot funding programme, which will support "high-risk, deep technological innovations with transformative potential" – particularly in areas with "extensive research but a lack of commercial exploitation." The application process will be in two stages, with the first call for proposals (solution development) under the EIC Work Programme 2026 funding projects for up to nine months with a maximum of EUR 300,000 for initial feasibility studies. Calls for proposals for the second stage are planned for the EIC Work Programme 2027. Projects selected in the first stage could then receive funding of up to €2.5 million for activities such as prototype development and testing in real-world environments with users.

The programme also introduces changes to the **EIC Accelerator** evaluation procedure, as well as higher project budgets for **EIC Pathfinder Open** projects (up to €4.5 million). Furthermore, from 2026 onwards, results from research infrastructure projects funded under the EU Framework Programme will also be eligible for **EIC Transition** calls.

Please note that the final version of the EIC Work Programme 2026 is expected to be published in early fall 2025. Until then, changes are still possible in all areas of the Work Programme.

Association of Third Countries to Horizon Europe

Republic of Korea

On 17 July 2025, the Republic of Korea and the European Union signed the **agreement on Korea's association with Horizon Europe. The association applies exclusively to Pillar II, "Global Challenges & European Industrial Competitiveness"**, i.e., collaborative research in the thematic clusters. As announced in a <u>press release of the European Commission</u>, Korean organisations now have unrestricted access to Pillar II funding and can also coordinate projects.

Integration of Social Sciences and Humanities in Horizon Europe

1st Monitoring report on SSH-flagged projects funded under Pillar II of Horizon Europe



The European Commission has published a report on the status of the integration of social sciences and humanities (SSH) in Horizon Europe. SSH integration is defined in the Horizon Europe regulation as an overarching task of the framework programme. The report covers the first three years of the current framework programme, with a focus on the clusters in Pillar II that require the participation of SSH researchers — the so-called SSH-flagged topics.

The report states that 40% of the topics advertised in the clusters between 2021 and 2023 were SSH-flagged. Furthermore, at least one SSH partner – meaning an

organisation responsible for the implementation of at least one SSH deliverable in the project – was involved in 88% of these projects.

In addition to statistical analysis, the report contains best practice examples for SSH integration in projects and provides recommendations. It also briefly discusses SSH participation in other parts of the programme, such as the European Research Council.

INSPIRING ERA presentations on EU copyright and data access for research in the age of AI

What impact do EU copyright and data access rules have on research and AI? What obstacles and solutions exist? In summer, INSPIRING ERA organized a Europe-wide exchange on this topic to explore how legally compliant data handling and open science can be achieved. Both topics are also currently anchored in the new ERA Policy Agenda 2025-2027. The presentations are now available <u>online</u>.

EU4Health Work Programme 2025

The <u>EU4Health Work Programme 2025</u> was published by the European Commission on 23 July 2025. It sets out the European Commission's key priorities in the areas of health systems, digital transformation, and disease prevention. Although it is primarily aimed at public authorities and health actors, targeted opportunities are also available for research and innovation organisations to participate, e.g., in the areas of early cancer detection,

cardiovascular health, digital health infrastructure, and AI applications. With over €195 million in funding and strong links to Horizon Europe and the European Health Data Space, the program promotes collaboration, data-driven innovation, and evidence-based implementation. Dates for the publication of calls for proposals and application deadlines are yet to be announced, but a preliminary schedule is available, subject to change.
