What is Erasmus+?

The European Union’s Erasmus+ programme supports education, youth and sport. It includes various funding opportunities, not only for the mobility of individuals, but also for cooperation and internationalization in higher education.

The first programme generation went from 2014 to 2020. The second programme generation has started in 2021 and lasts until 2027.

The Erasmus+ Programme is divided in:

- **Key Action 1:** Mobility of Individuals
- **Key Action 2:** Cooperation among Organisations and Institutions
- **Key Action 3:** Support to Policy Development and Cooperation
- **Jean Monnet Actions**

Who can take part in the Erasmus+ programme?

In general, organizations participating in Erasmus+ projects have to be established in Programme Countries. In addition, some actions are open to participants from Partner Countries. The list of all Erasmus+ Programme and Partner Countries can be found [here](#).
