The Falklands/Malvinas War — also known as the South Atlantic Conflict of 1982 — was a brief but significant armed confrontation between the United Kingdom and Argentina, with relevant consequences for both nations. The conflict has given rise to an extensive body of literature, particularly within Argentine scholarship. This presentation will examine the primary historiographical approaches to the war and propose some potential lines of enquiry.

María Inés Tato holds a PhD in History from the University of Buenos Aires. She is a Principal Researcher of Argentina's National Scientific and Technical Research Council, based at the Institute of Argentine and Latin American History "Dr Emilio Ravignani'. She coordinates that institute's Group of Historical War Studies. Dr. Tato is also a Professor in the Master's program in War History at the Superior War College, Army Faculty, National Defence University.
