Dioscuri Programme: Launch of first call for proposals in the Czech Republic

With the person-centered funding program already well established in Poland, the Max Planck Society (MPG) and the Czech Ministry of Education, Youth and Sports (MEYS) are now looking for talented scientists to establish their research group at a Czech research institution. Up to three Centre leaders will be funded in the frame of the first call for Dioscuri Centres in the Czech Republic. Early-career researchers from all scientific disciplines are invited to submit their application for a Dioscuri Centre until July 25th, 2022. Going beyond the scope of a project grant, a Dioscuri Centre is built around a distinguished researcher position. It is awarded to excellent scientists capable of establishing and leading an outstanding, highly visible research group. The Dioscuri Programme aims to strengthen and expand scientific excellence in Central and Eastern Europe and is currently being implemented in Poland and the Czech Republic. The funding for the Dioscuri Centres is shared equally between the Federal Ministry of Education and Research and the MEYS.
