Why TSU?

- As the first higher education institution in the South Caucasus, TSU is the only university from the region ranked regularly within the Times Higher Education World University Rankings;
- TSU has over 200 partner institutions in 56 countries, more than 240 Erasmus+ International Credit Mobility programs with 86 universities in 26 countries in Europe;
- TSU is one of the best academic destinations for youth all over the world with rich academic offers and vibrant student life. The number of incoming exchange students has tripled during the past 5 years;

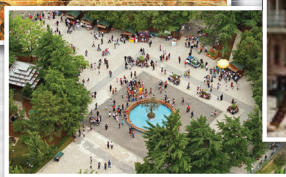
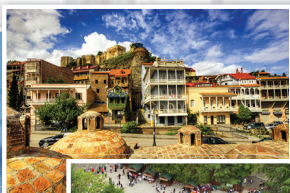
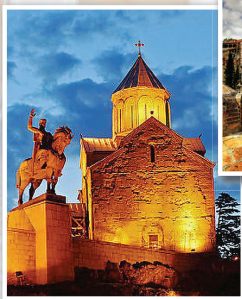
Tbilisi – City of Art, Culture and Ancient History at the Crossroads of West and East

Tbilisi is the capital and the largest city of Georgia. Because of its location at the crossroads of Europe and Asia, throughout history Tbilisi was a point of contention among various global powers. The architecture in the city is a mixture of local (Georgian) and Byzantine, Neoclassical, Art Nouveau, Beaux-Arts, Middle Eastern, and Soviet modern styles.

Main Sightseeing

The city history is reflected in its architecture, which is a mix of medieval, classical, Soviet and modern structures. Tbilisi has been home to people of diverse cultural, ethnic, and religious backgrounds.

Tbilisi has important landmarks and sightseeing locations such as: Parliament of Georgia, National Museum of Georgia, Tbilisi Opera and Ballet Theatre, Shota Rustaveli State Academic Theatre, the Sameba Cathedral, The Bridge of Peace and other important institutions and landmarks.
