

Call for Applications “UP Global Topics – Visiting Lectureship” Program

Under the internal funding program “UP Global Topics – Visiting Lectureships,” the university management annually grants **financial support** to up to four UP scientists of all subjects who wish to apply for a visiting lectureship in the [DAAD Visiting Lecturer Program “Funding of Foreign Visiting Lecturers for Teaching Activities at German Universities” \(Model I. A - Visiting Lectureships\)](#) in the amount of the faculty’s own share of **10% of the wage costs for a Senior Scientist (W3)**. In addition, **travel expenses** will be covered for the applying lecturers/chairs (short-term mobility to the home university of the visiting lecturers). The goal of the program is to 1. create an incentive for the internationalization of teaching on the undergraduate level (bachelor's degree) and 2. contribute to the development of global topics as outlined in the UN program on Education for Sustainable Development (ESD). The following applications for guest lectureships are eligible for co-financing by the University of Potsdam (in order of priority):

Priority 1) Teaching on BA level *with* Global Topics: The teaching obligations of six hours per week per semester are offered in English in the elective or compulsory component of a Bachelor's program and are to be thematically related to the framework topic Global Topics/Education for Sustainable Development.

Priority 2) Teaching on BA level *without* Global Topics: The teaching obligations of six hours per week per semester are offered in English in the elective or elective compulsory area of a Bachelor's degree program (open topic).

Priority 3) Teaching on MA level *with* Global Topics: The teaching obligations of six hours per week per semester are offered in English in a Master's degree program and are to be thematically related to the framework topic Global Topics/Education for Sustainable Development.

What are Global Topics?

“Global Topics” are one of the strategic fields of action in the current [internationalization strategy of the University of Potsdam](#) (“Internationalization through Global Topics”) and are the framework topic of the “UP Global Topics – Visiting Lectureships.” The goal of this field of action, which is yet to be further developed, is to sensitize the university community to questions of sustainability, knowledge transfer and international cooperation on global future topics (in line with the [UN Sustainable Development Goals](#)). The designated framework topic is open to all subjects and faculties. The courses offered are to contribute to a global discourse in a broader sense, e.g., by addressing international dimensions and comparisons of a topic, as well as by focusing on the resolution of global problems and the advancement of an international dialog.

Who benefits from the program?

“UP Global Topics - Visiting Lectureships” expand the range of courses in the elective and mandatory components of Bachelor's and Master's programs for all students and allow international exchange students to participate in courses without sufficient knowledge of the German language. Providing offers for international Bachelor's students, in particular, can in turn lead to the creation of more exchange opportunities for UP students at partner universities.

The program eases the burden on the financial resources of the faculty, because the university management will cover the faculty's own share of wage payments. This facilitates the recruitment of renowned international visiting lecturers (up to a salary comparable to the W3 salary level). In addition, travel expenses for the applying scholars, which are not included in the DAAD program, are covered. The program will lead to an enhanced exchange on teaching global issues/Education for Sustainable Development (ESD) among faculty members.

Application Process “UP Global Topics – Visiting Lectureship” Program

Academics from all disciplines can apply twice a year by November 1 (for the DAAD call in October with a January deadline) and May 1 (for DAAD Call in April with July deadline) for the “UP Global Topics - Visiting Lectureships” program, which provides financial support for up to four lectureships in line with a W3 salary. The program is a **co-financing** option in addition to the regular **DAAD Visiting Lectureship Program “Funding**

of Foreign Visiting Lecturers for Teaching Activities at German Universities” (Model A - Visiting Lectureships).

After submission of the application, the scholars will receive the corresponding funding decision so that the funding approval from the university management can be included in the DAAD application with the January or July deadlines. This effectively means that the overall application process would be a two-step process for the applicants.

The **application should be sent via email (1-2 pages in text format)** directed at Dr. Regina Neum-Flux (regina.neum-flux@uni-potsdam.de).

The following criteria are obligatory or desirable for the internal UP application and should be described in the application:

- **Obligatory:** The teaching obligations of six hours per week per semester are carried out in the elective or compulsory component of one or several Bachelor's programs or in a Master's program.
- **Optional (obligatory when teaching on Master level):** The courses offered are thematically related to the framework topic “Global Topics”(see above for description; topic open to all faculties).
- **Obligatory:** The hosting department provides an appropriate infrastructure for the visiting lectureship.
- **Desirable:** Invitations to lecturers from EDUC partner universities (<https://educalliance.eu/>) are encouraged.
- **Desirable:** The use of blended learning formats would be desirable.
- **Desirable:** If possible, visiting lecturers should also be available for examinations.

If the application is successful, the university management will cover the faculty's own share of up to **10% of the wage costs comparable for a W3 salary** required by the DAAD.

In addition, the University of Potsdam will cover **travel expenses** of the hosting chairs/lecturers for a reciprocal visit (**short-term mobility of up to five days**) to the home university of the visiting lecturers. The additional travel funds are intended to support the mutual in-depth study of the respective topic in research and teaching.

Applicants who are successful with the DAAD application are asked to prepare an **extended DAAD report** after the end of the visiting lectureship. In addition to the six questions asked by the DAAD, there is also a question regarding **the extent to which the visiting lectureship could contribute to the development of an interdisciplinary Bachelor's program.**

Example Timeline (DAAD October application)

- November 1: Application deadline for the Program “UP Global Topics – Visiting Lectureship” (Application of 1-2 pages in text format to Dr. Regina Neum-Flux, regina.neum-flux@uni-potsdam.de)
- November 15: Funding approval given by the university management (Office of the Vice President for International Affairs)
- January 15: Application deadline for the DAAD Visiting Lectureship Program “Funding of Foreign Visiting Lecturers for Teaching Activities at German Universities”(Model I. A – Visiting Lectureships)
- October 1: Beginning of the visiting lectureship (3-12 months depending on the application submitted to the DAAD)
