# **Call for Proposals: Teaching & Training**

Funding to Expand and Cultivate the International Partnerships of the University of Potsdam with a Focus on Teaching Visits and Further Training and Continuing Education for Technical and Administrative Personnel

Dear Sir or Madam,

Dear colleagues,

Complementing the "KoUP" Cooperation Funding call for proposals and offering different focus areas each year, the university's "Teaching & Training" program also provides funding for the implementation of activities with Potsdam's partner universities. The activities funded by "Teaching & Training" focus on teaching and continuing education and serve to cultivate cooperation projects and partnerships of the University of Potsdam outside Europe and beyond research cooperation. The financial resources come from the university budget and third-party funding, which are partly subject to funding regulations.

## The following activities are eligible for funding:

**Program Line 1: Teaching visits** of at least 5 days and eight hours per week.<sup>1</sup> The teaching visits are to complement the range of courses offered at the host institution and to provide an international component. Using your visit to develop further cooperation activities is expressly welcome.

**Program Line 2:** Activities in **further training and continuing education for technical and administrative personnel**, e.g. to exchange experiences with partners, for job shadowing or further training. Priority will be given to applications directly related to the implementation of research projects.

**Program Line 3: Travel activities to prepare cooperation projects,** as long as these projects are not eligible for "KoUP" funding.

January 15, 2022. Decisions on the applications are expected to be made by February 28, 2022.

### **Expenses eligible for funding:**

- Travel and accommodation expenses in accordance with the German Travel Expenses Act, maximum of € 4,000
- Visa fees
- Fees for coronavirus testing

The funds must be used in the calendar year 2022.

### **Eligible applicants:**

#### Program line 1 and 3:

Professors and academic staff members at all faculties of the University of Potsdam, including doctoral students (only together with a university instructor), emeriti, part-time lecturers.

#### Program line 2:

Only technical and administrative personnel as well as employees of the central institutions can apply for the activities in further training and continuing education.

### **Application documents:**

Attached you will find the documents for the call for proposals, which consist of the information sheet and an Excel file for project applications to be handed in when submitting the application (please send it back as an xls file). You will also need to submit a one-page project draft and a preliminary financial plan. When preparing your financial plans, please consult the information provided by Division 3 on international travel costs (Auslandsreisekostenverordnung).
