Start of admission (no enrollment possible – enrollment will re-open next day for second admission round)	April 8, 2021

Exam and internship period	July 26, 2021 – July 31, 2021

* For programs that require course registration via PULS, all registrations that are completed until the last day of the first admission round are treated equally, i.e., acceptance into the course is not related to the time of your registration.

COURSE CATALOGUE

Each semester's courses are listed in the University of Potsdam's course catalogue. There is a general course catalogue which lists ALL courses taught at the University of Potsdam (regardless of the teaching language) and there is an international course catalogue which ONLY lists courses taught in English. You can access both catalogues as a PDF via:

The second and **best way to access the general course catalogue is via our online system "PULS"**. This has the advantage of being able to book your courses at the same time as searching for them. You can access it as follows:

Online access via PULS

- <http://www.uni-potsdam.de/> → top horizontal menu "Online-Dienste" → PULS → log in with your username and password → top horizontal menu "Veranstaltungen" → left vertical menu "Vorlesungsverzeichnis" → all courses listed via faculty and department
- There are very few exceptions in which you cannot enroll for classes via PULS. In that case, there will be no "apply now"-button visible and you simply need to contact your *Austauschkoordinator* or the responsible lecturer prior to the first day of teaching.

ECTS

- **“Comment” section in PULS:** To get a general idea of how many credit points you can attain, go to *“Einzelansicht”* of a course and click on *“comment”* in the top horizontal table, which will direct you to the department’s homepage with additional information on content and grading.
- **Department Homepage:** Some departments list general information about ECTS on their homepage. There, you can also find each department’s *“Kommentiertes Vorlesungsverzeichnis”* stating the same information as the PULS *“comment”* section.
- **Personal Advice:** Your chosen course’s lecturer will be happy to advise you; you can also contact your *Austauschkoordinator* for additional advice.
- **Lecturers:** The final decision about the number of ECTS and the corresponding workload lies with your chosen course’s lecturer.

THINGS TO BEAR IN MIND

- Exchange students are **not** entitled to participate in language courses offered by **ZESSKO** unless there are spaces available.
- Speak to your lecturers – it is advisable to introduce yourself as an exchange student when you enroll for the course as well as when negotiating the ECTS and corresponding workload.
- Do not forget to **un-enroll** from any classes you do not wish to attend until **May 10, 2021**.
- As an exchange student, you cannot register for exams via PULS. Simply contact your course’s lecturer and register for the exam this way.
- As an exchange student, your grades will not be listed in PULS. Therefore, you need to ask your lecturer to fill in a *“Leistungsnachweis”* at the end of the semester.
- If you only need a confirmation of attendance for a certain course, please discuss the possibility of getting a *“Teilnahmeschein”* with the lecturer at the start of the semester.
