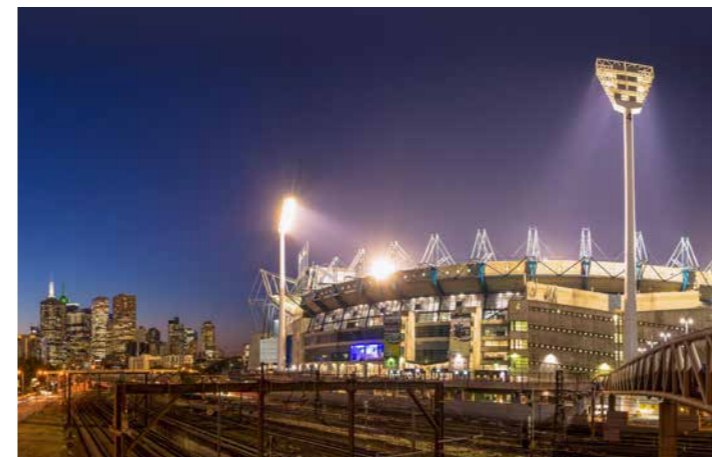

The State of Victoria



Away from the cities, Victoria has a wealth of attractions for nature lovers.

Victoria's size makes it easy to explore. Rent a car, catch a train or book a tour to see the Great Ocean Road, Phillip Island, The Otways, Wilsons Promontory and the Yarra Valley wineries. Go hiking in the You Yangs or the Grampians. Visit the historic cities of Healesville and Castlemaine, or take in the alpine wilderness of the Snowy Mountains area.

Victoria is Australia's second most populous state. Originally inhabited by the Aboriginal people of the Kulin nation, Victoria is now home to six million people from every part of the world.



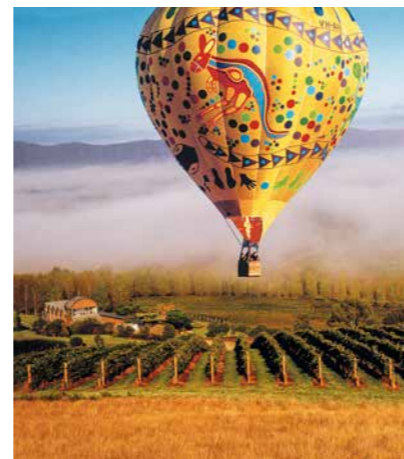

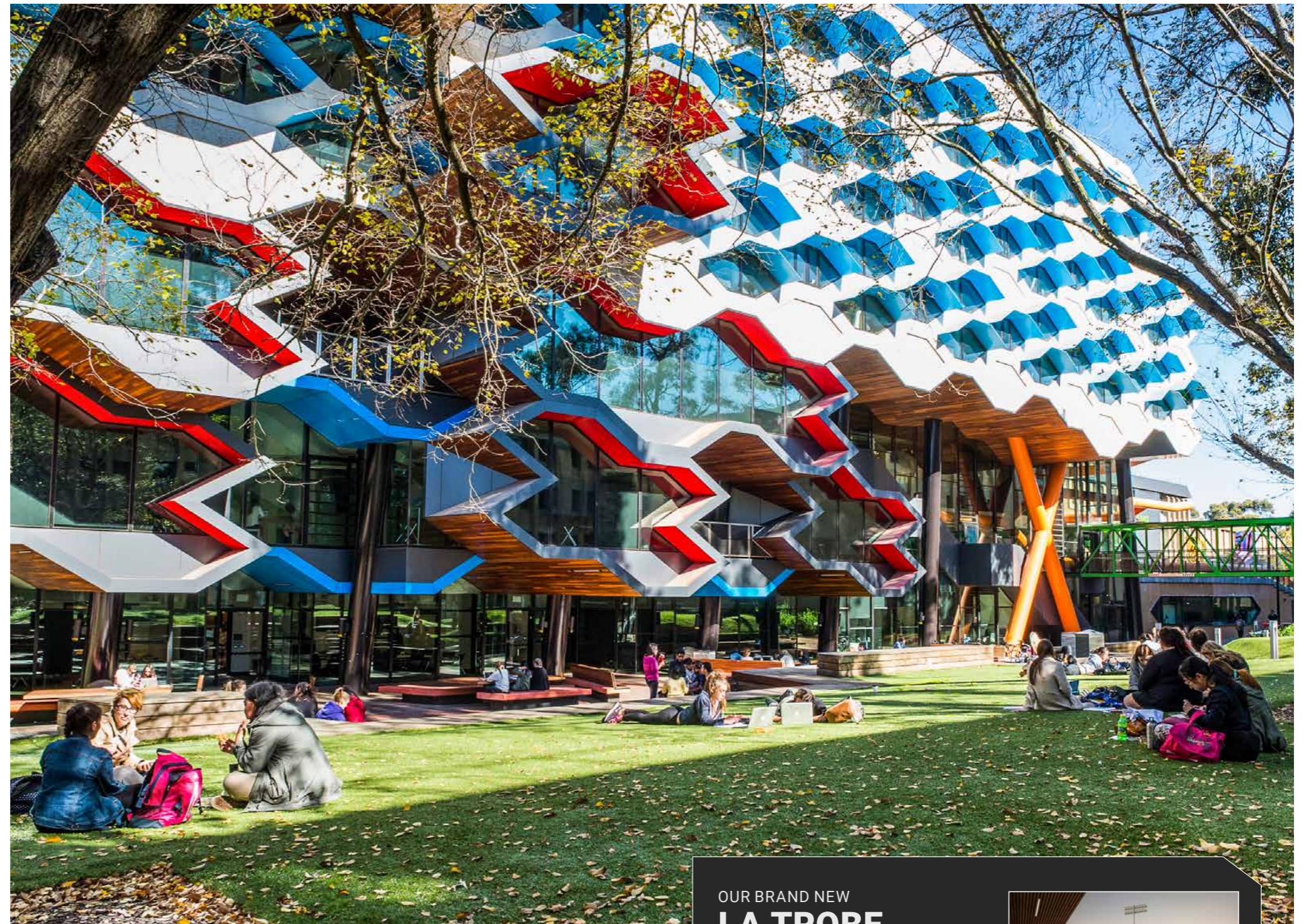
Bendigo Campus

Tuition fees

The tuition fees for the 2019 Study Abroad program per semester are shown below:

4-subject option (60 credit points): A\$9 200
3-subject option (45 credit points): A\$6 900

Tuition fees are subject to change annually.³

2. Entry into some health sciences subjects is restricted and cannot be guaranteed.

3. 60 credit points (4 subjects) is a full-time study load at La Trobe University. If your home institution requires a 5-subject enrolment, special approval will be required by La Trobe University and additional fees will apply.

Attach supporting documents

Complete your application by scanning and uploading the following documents to the Student Portal:

- copy of your official academic transcript (if your transcript is not in English, please also provide a certified English translation)
- evidence of your English language proficiency, if you are from a non-English speaking country
- one-page personal statement stating why you would like to study at La Trobe University as a Study Abroad student
- academic reference from your home institution
- copy of your passport ID page.

Accept your offer

Once your application is approved, you'll receive an email with your offer letter and a step-by-step guide on how to accept your offer, pay your tuition fees and provide any outstanding documents.

06

Apply for your student visa

Once you have accepted your offer, you will receive a Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE). This enables you to apply for an Australian student visa.

Important dates

Semester 1, 2019

Orientation: 25 February – 1 March

Semester 2, 2019

Orientation: 22 – 26 July
Semester dates: 29 July – 21 November

You should apply to La Trobe University at least 12 weeks before Orientation to allow sufficient time for your visa application.

Living costs

Making the decision to study overseas is exciting and life changing. Before you leave, it is important to consider the costs of living in Australia.

The below guide provides an average estimate of the costs associated with your studies, so that you can start planning.

The Department of Home Affairs recommends that you allow A\$1 690 per month for living in Australia.
