## Towards a just typology of climate mobility

Climate change impacts are increasingly becoming drivers of human mobility, within and across borders. Although there is growing research attention to this phenomenon, there remains a political protections gap for people on the move due to climate change. While categories of migration, planned relocation, and displacement have been used to describe the types of movements, they risk reducing the complexity of mobility experiences. In this presentation, a typology is proposed to better understand the diversity of experiences of climate mobility in order to inform people-centred policymaking.
