

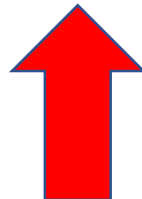
Societal Transformation Processes. A Colombian-German Dialogue from an interdisciplinary Perspective
