4. Places:

- 20 places for students and researchers from other overseas universities. Students must be endorsed by a lecturer and spots will be allocated by order of registration
- 20 places for students and researchers at the University of the Balearic Islands or students from other Spanish universities who wish to undertake a SICUE stay for coming academic years. By order of registration.

Sessions will be run in Spanish, Catalan and English. Alongside the different presentations, attendees will have the opportunity to experience different class sessions in the normal faculty hours.

1. Factsheet:

This research seminar offers the chance to reflect in an interdisciplinary approach on the cultural, literary and geographic dynamics linked to the conjunction of maritime, island and tourism spaces in the Balearic Islands as well as other settings. Many researchers across the departments in the Faculty of Philosophy and Arts work on these issues linked to the specialisation fields of English studies, Catalan and Spanish language and literature, political philosophy and geography. A selection of their research findings will be presented in

different sessions, in dialogue with different guest speakers from universities in Spain and overseas.

In this way, the research seminar aims to establish an exchange between researchers, lecturers and students. Given this perspective, the seminar aims to host undergraduate and postgraduate students from other European universities, and put them in contact with students and researchers at the University of the Balearic Islands. It is inspired by previous experiences with field trips by European students who travel and stay on the island, and contact local lecturers for deeper insight into island realities. It thus aims to contextualise these realities into a broader framework connected to those in other settings and, in this way, includes internationalisation of relevant content for UIB students taking part in the event. The aim is also to promote the image of the University of the Balearic Islands and, specifically, the Faculty of Philosophy and Arts, as a hub for undergraduate and postgraduate Erasmus students, as well as a home for researchers in training.

The conference format is modular and multilingual. Sessions in Catalan, Spanish and English are planned, as is the opportunity to attend sessions from current subjects taught in these subjects on the programmes at the Faculty of Philosophy and Arts.

2. Objectives:

- Boost the exchange of perspectives on cultural contact from social and economic processes such as globalisation and tourism.
- Bolster contact between students and researchers in the Faculty of Philosophy and Arts, and those from other universities who have shown an interest in enhancing collaboration.
