Do I need to pay a tuition fee to study at the program?

There is no tuition fee. However, students have to pay a regular administrative term fee (Semestergebühren) which includes a 6-month ticket for all public transportation in the state of Brandenburg and in Berlin. More details on those fees can be found here:

■ Is MSc Cognitive Science an NC ("Numerus Clausus") admission restriction program? How many places are available each year?

Yes, the program has restricted admission, meaning that there are only 20 first semester study places to be filled annually.

■ Which career paths does the MSc Cognitive Science program prepare graduates for?

The program provides graduates with a solid expertise in the field of Cognitive Science and good skills in doing research. The graduates with research aspirations may consider following the research path through a PhD (at the UP or other Universities), other graduates can find employment outside Academia – in startups, tech companies with a cognitive slant, government panels, etc.

APPLICATION TO THE PROGRAM

• Where can I see the application deadlines? What is the difference between the first and the advanced semester application?

If you have just completed a BA degree and intend to start your study at the MA level, you need to follow the "1st semester" deadline.

However, if you have already been enrolled to a similar MA degree at another University and would like to transfer to the University of Potsdam to any semester except the first semester, then select the "Advanced studies" deadline.

What are the main admission requirements?

For a successful application you need to provide:

- (1) a BA degree that is related to Cognitive Science
- (2) proofs of either your mathematical training (linear algebra, calculus) and/ or practical training in experimental psychology (designing, conducting, analyzing, presenting an experiment) and/ or skills in programming experiments you need at least 6 ECTS in two of these three domains
- (3) a certificate of your English language skills C1 level

To enter the program, German language skills need **not** be demonstrated.

Which degrees are considered as related to Cognitive Sciences?

The degrees in General Psychology, Cognitive Psychology, Cognitive Neuroscience, or Cognitive Science as well as degrees in Philosophy, Linguistics, Robotics and AI with a clear link to cognitive processes are considered as relevant and qualifying for the program.

■ My BA is not closely related to Cognitive Sciences. Can I still apply?

Most of the regular applicants have a BA in Psychology/Neuroscience/Cognitive Sciences, but the program values and encourages diversity of backgrounds, since Cognitive Science can be studied from different viewpoints. Therefore, the

degrees in Neurobiology, Human Biology, Physical Exercise/Sports, Medicine, and Computer Science with strong cognitive focus can be also accepted as qualifying if applicants - holders of these BAs satisfy all admission requirements.

On the contrary, students with a standard engineering background or with interest in clinical issues will be disappointed by the program and, therefore, should not apply.

■ I am currently enrolled in a MA/MSc program, or I have already completed an MA/MSc – can I still apply?

Prospective students who were or are enrolled in a master's program that is the same or related to the subject of the current program, or if it is in a similar academic field, must apply for and obtain from the Study Board a placement notice prior to submitting an application and enclose the notice in the application. Only candidates who obtained a placement notice for the first semester entry can take part in the first semester application process. The placement procedure is meant to guarantee that prospective students who qualify for advanced semester entry based on academic credentials obtained in previous studies do not prevent someone qualified for first semester entry to receive an admission offer - that is important since the places in the program are limited to 20.

In case the Study Board places you in the higher semester, you can submit an application for it (please note that the deadlines for this application are different from the first semester application). The credit points obtained in similar courses in your previous MSc degree will then be transferred.

However, if the similarity between two Master degrees is very high, the Board may deny placement in the MSc program and suggest applying for a PhD.

So, as a holder of the MSc degree in a closely related field, you first need to check for the overlaps between the courses in your MSc program with the MSc Cognitive Science (the course list is available on the program's webpage) and if you have obtained at least 15 ECTS in similar courses, it would qualify you for an advanced semester entry. Then you will need to follow a placement procedure and apply for a higher semester.

Important: If the placement notification is missing, you will be excluded from the admission procedure.

Can you provide more information on the requirement of Experimental Psychology Practice, Mathematics skills and Experimental Programming skills?

Since the program has a strong research focus, it is obligatory for all applicants to have experience in either Experimental Psychology Practice and/ or Mathematics and or Experimental Programming (equivalent to 6 ECTS in two of these three domains) prior to the application. This requirement can pose a serious problem and be an exclusion criterion for students with some BAs (e.g. Philosophy) that usually lack all three courses in the curricula.

In this case, to cover this requirement applicants - holders of such degrees <u>prior</u> <u>to their application</u> need either to take additional courses in Mathematics and/ or Experimental Programming and/ or to arrange an internship in the lab that conducts Psychology/ Neuroscience/ Cognitive Science research.

• Are there any preparatory courses (e.g., for Math or to acquire the specific terminology in English)?

MSc Cognitive Science instructors **do not** provide any preparatory courses (especially courses of English; this is an English-taught degree, and all applicants are required to have a certain level of English already mastered).

If you want to familiarize yourself with Cognitive science/Neuroscience topics/terminology in English, you may enroll for any online courses in Neuroscience/Brain Science at Cousera/other platforms or read journal articles on the point.

Note: courses from Coursera and other online platforms are for your general training on the subject only and **are not** accepted as evidence of obtaining e.g., sufficient Math skills that may be required to qualify you for the program.

• If courses attesting to my Experimental Psychology Practice/Mathematics/ Experimental Programming skills are not in my BA Transcript (I took them additionally), which documents do I need to submit to prove my skills?

For the Internship attesting your Experimental Psychology Practice skills, please submit a certificate of your research engagement in duration of at least 180 hours. For Mathematics courses, please submit a Transcript/ Exam Note/ Professor statement with your grade and ECTS. For your Experimental Programming skills, please submit a proof of these skills in the form of a Transcript/ Exam Note/ Professor statement with your grade and ECTS, and otherwise in the form of a professor statement confirming your skills as demonstrated, e.g. as part of an internship or student job.

Can courses in Statistics be accepted as confirmation of Mathematics skills?

No, only courses in Linear Algebra and Calculus satisfy this requirement. Courses in Statistics cannot be accepted as a proof of your knowledge of Mathematics, since they do not provide an in-depth introduction in the topics of Advanced Mathematics.

• I do not have neither Experimental Psychology Practice nor Mathematics skills nor Experimental Programming skills – Can I still apply?

No, applicants that lack skills in *two of the three domains of* Mathematics, Experimental Psychology practice, and Experimental Programming **cannot** be admitted to the program. Conditional admission offers to the program are also **cannot** be provided.

Should I write a Statement of Purpose?

No, since 2024 there is no longer required to write a Statement of Purpose – instead, applicants need to submit a Subject Specific Test – a questionnaire on applicant's specific skills, experiences, etc. The test form can be downloaded here:

You need to download the form, fill it in and then submit it via Uni-Assist as part of the application.

After Uni-Assist check completion, the applications are forwarded to the UP. Usually, the Admission Board needs up to 4-6 weeks to process the applications. Then they are sent to the Admission Dept. for final ranking.

Usually, the admission notifications are sent by August 15, therefore, we ask applicants to wait until then before inquiring about their status.

STUDYING PART-TIME

■ Is it possible to study the MSc Cognitive Science part-time? What are the steps to transfer from the full-time to the part-time study format?

■ I plan to study part-time, therefore, it's important for me to know how courses are usually scheduled.

It is hard to say: It will depend on several factors, e. g., on the Choice Modules you'll select (which can even be in another university and will follow the scheduling principles of that University).

In general, there are several course organization types at the UP:

- (1) regular with a class every week in a specified day/time slot;
- (2) blocked as an intensive course with classes taking place in one week, Monday to Friday, from 9 to 17 or from 10 to 18;
- (3) Semi-Blocked during several weeks, with 2-3 intensive days each week (usually Friday-Saturday) from 9 to 17 or from 10 to 18.

• If I cannot come to Germany this year, is it possible to preserve my admission and use it in the next academic year?

No, it is not possible. The reason behind this is the following: since the admission procedure requires ranking the applicants, next year you may not get the same place in the ranking, since the new applicants may have stronger qualifications compared to applicants with whom you were ranked this year.

Therefore, in this case, admitting you in the next academic year based on the previous year's results will be discriminating against another applicant with stronger qualifications whose place you'll fill.

Therefore, if you are rejecting your place this year, you'll need to apply again and go through the same selection process again next year.

■ What does admission with an obligation (Bridge Module) mean? When should I complete the Bridge Module? Will the Bridge Module count into my Master's Degree?

There is no need (and no option) to complete the Bridge Module prior to the beginning of studies – you will be able to register for it after enrollment. Each bridge module will count as 6 ECTS into your MSc degree. You can complete **only one** bridge module (that is specified in your admission notification) and you should register for a bridge module **only if** your admission notification contains the obligation to do so.

■ I received a rejection, but I cannot agree with the reasons for rejection. How can I submit an appeal?

As it is stated in your rejection notice, you have the right to appeal. To do so, please forward your appeal to the address indicated in your notice.

What is the enrollment deadline? Which documents should I submit?

■ What happens if I can not register for the courses by the time instruction period starts? ... or if I have not reached Germany by then?

The deadline for course registration is October 15 and course de-registration is usually possible until November 10. Both processes can be done remotely, online. In case you arrive a little late, you can always contact course instructors directly and find a solution (e.g., online participation, additional task(s) to compensate for the missed time, etc.).

• I registered for a course but changed my mind after the Introductory meeting – can I not participate?

Yes, to do that you should follow the de-registration procedure within the abovementioned deadlines (November 10). If you did not de-register and did not participate you will get a failing grade in your PULS record.

• I would like to replace a Choice Module by the course from another University – which procedure should I follow?

You should submit the complete course description and the filled *request for approval* to the Study Board meeting for the change of the elective course to be approved.

MAKING THE MOST OF YOUR STUDY TIME

• I am interested in participating in research projects/internship at the UP. What are the main research foci? What should I do to apply?

There are several different labs within the Humanities faculty; they mostly conduct psychology research (with such methods as EEG, eye-tracking, TMS, kinematics, virtual reality, etc.) and computation modelling. Links with other departments can be established on the initiative of students willing to do research in a particular area. There is a Baby lab in the building; the Sports Dept. also has interest in projects about Cognitive Science.

• I am interested in attending an experiment as a participant. How can I find experiments?

Participating in experiments is a good way to learn from an expert more about the specific methodology that you may be interested in using yourself for your MSc Thesis project. Also, for some courses there is a requirement to obtain participant hours.

Does the Cognitive Science program also have relations with other cognitive science research facilities in the region?

There are occasional joint lectures or block seminars with Humboldt University and Free University that students from all universities may attend.

Also, you may suggest a course from another university that you are interested in taking to be approved by the Study Board as a replacement for a Choice Module.
