

**First Amendment to the Entrance and Admissions Regulations for the Master's Program in Jewish Theology at the University of Potsdam**

**18 January 2017**

On 18 January 2017, the advisory board of the Department of Philosophy at the University of Potsdam adopted the following amendment pursuant to § 9 para. 5 sentence 2 in conjunction with § 72 para. 2 no. 1 of the Brandenburg Higher Education Act (BbgHG) of 28 April 2014 (GVBl.I/14, [no. 18] amended by Art. 2 of the law of 1 July 2015 (GVBl.I/15, [no. 18]), in conjunction with § 5 para. 4, § 7 para. 2, § 8 para. 2 and § 16 para. 2 of the Brandenburg Higher Education Admissions Act (BbgHZG) of 1 July 2015 (GVBl.I/15, [no. 18]), last amended by the law of 17 December 2015 (GVBl.I/15, [no. 38]), in conjunction with § 2 paras. 1-3, 5, § 19 para. 1 and § 20 of the Higher Education Admissions Regulations (HZV) of 23 February 2016 (GVBl.I/16, [no. 6]) and following Art. 21 para. 2 no. 1 of the Basic Regulations of the University of Potsdam (GrundO) of 17 December 2009 (AmBek. UP no. 4/2010 p. 60) in the version of the Third Amendment to the Basic Regulations of the University of Potsdam (GrundO) of 22 April 2015 (AmBek. UP no. 6/2015 p. 235), as well as the General Entrance and Admissions Regulations for non-teaching-track Master's programs at the University of Potsdam (Admissions Regulations – ZulO) of 24 February 2016 (AmBek. UP no. 3/2016 p. 76):<sup>1</sup>

Article 1

The Entrance and Admissions Regulations for the Master's program in Jewish Theology at the University of Potsdam of 6 July 2016 (AmBek. UP no. 17/2016 p. 1502) shall be amended as follows:

1. In § 3, para. 2 below shall be added after the existing para. 1:

“(2) Applicants whose native language is not German shall be exempt from § 4 para. 4 ZulO requiring proof of sufficient German language proficiency.”

Article 2

This Amendment enters into force on the day following its publication in the Official Bulletin of the University of Potsdam.
