In Dohuk St. Ith Llaha Church (viewpoint), Ancient Mosque. Route from Dohuk to Alqosh, Chaldean Town. Meeting in the Bishop's House with Father Dr. Salar Kajo / Father Aram Qayea, Nineveh Reconstruction Committee. Visits of Synagogue (tomb of Prophet Nahum) and Eastsyrian Monastery Rabban Hormizd (7th century). Back to Erbil. Farewell Dinner.
